Saturday, September 17, 2022

• Head of Education (HoE) Meet-and-Greet

2:00 p.m. – 3:00 p.m. @ Mercure Vaugirard Paris Porte de Versailles (Amédée Gordini Room) Attendance is mandatory for all ISEB students.

The Heads of Education (HoE) from each of the ISEB space agencies will introduce themselves and give a short presentation about ISEB, the program for the week, and other must-know information. The ISEB student program will be presented, and students will have the time to ask the HoE questions.

Cross-Cultural Workshop

3:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. @ Mercure Vaugirard Paris Porte de Versailles (Amédée Gordini Room) Attendance is mandatory for all ISEB students.

This workshop will be facilitated by experts in cross-cultural management and communication skills. The workshop will be divided into three parts: (1) networking in a multicultural context, (2) developing cultural awareness, and (3) enhancing presentation skills. By the end of the workshop, students will have the tools to navigate respectful interactions with people of different backgrounds, communicate in an international forum, and understand collaboration of international entities/organizations. Students will be required to complete the Cultural Nomad Profiler prior to the workshop, and will also have to prepare three elevator pitches for different audiences (senior-level officials, technical audiences, and non-technical audiences).

Icebreaker Reception

Sunday, September 18, 2022

ISEB Heads of Agencies (HoA) Interactive Session

4:30 p.m. – 5:30 p.m. @ International Student Zone (ISZ) (students are asked to arrive at 4:00 p.m.) Attendance is mandatory for all ISEB students.

ISEB students will have a rare opportunity to interact with heads of international space agencies in an up close and personal setting. Students will be divided into three groups in the ISZ, and the HoA will also be divided into three groups that will rotate every 20 minutes. Students will get the chance to ask their presubmitted questions and hear responses directly from the HoA. While this event is open to observers, only ISEB students will have the opportunity to ask questions.



Monday, September 19, 2022

Presentations from JAXA Students

Each student selected by JAXA is engaged in interesting outreach activities. In this session, each student will give a poster presentation on their outreach activities about Mars exploration, rocket development, satellites, cosmic rays, etc. Several poster presentations will also showcase equipment developed by students, including a small, easy-to-handle detector, a VR display, and a small satellite model.

Presentations from winners of the ESA Défi Aerospace Challenge

The winners of ESA's <u>Student Aerospace Challenge 2021-22</u> will give presentations about their designs. This challenge dared tertiary education student teams to work on various aspects of a suborbital manned vehicle. Students were able to choose from 13 different work packages, ranging from promotion/communication, to aerodynamic and flight control, to mission profile and concept, and others.

Workshops will be highly interactive and will focus on concepts such as solar storms, planetary motion, satellite operations, astronaut physical training, and artificial intelligence.

The guided tour of the Palais Garnier will be followed by a semi-private three-course lunch at Brasserie Rosie. They travelled more than 10,000 km across France to establish connections with the 130 producers with whom they work directly.
